*"... In a grown up society where people have learned that the prospect of heaven is a myth, and the church doesn't have power to condemn people to hell, then the idea of continuing to derive morality from religious codes is really very childish."*

*"... This idea of Alan's from a kind of meaning point of view - that we have to wait until somebody's dead for their life to amount to anything is a moral monstrosity! The idea that middle class people have a meaningful life and somehow the starving in Africa need the promise of heaven to offer any meaning to their squalid existence, I think is morally monstrous!"*

*"... We've got enough challenges in a secular life [and thank goodness people have not so much 'lost their faith' but found their 'freedom of ideas'] ... without adding mythical, pre-scientific, fairy-tale challenges into it .... Certainly, in my experience, since getting rid of those ideas I have been profoundly and permanently happier"*

## **Christians being forced into the closet**

If you're a Christian, forget about using your home as a B&B for the Lancashire tourist trade. A court ruling last week - plus a new case this week - threaten only legal heartache and hefty bills for damages.

You can also rule yourself out of marriage counselling after a Christian Relate therapist was sacked ... and that rather pleasant job of marrying people in a registry office is also not for you, following the dismissal of a Christian registrar.

Hoping to adopt? Perhaps not ... Society is crying out for carers but not, it seems, Christians as the law closes down their adoption agencies.

The serial banning of Christians from public life, job by job, is due to equality laws favouring the beliefs of homosexuals rather than those of Christians.

Gay couple Martyn Hall and Steven Preddy could easily have chosen another hotel instead of demanding a double bed in a family B&B serving for a generation "married couples only".

So, too, could another gay couple suing Christian guesthouse owners this week.

Relate could have offered a gay couple another counsellor, just as the registry office could have provided another registrar.

Many secular adoption agencies offer children to all forms of partnerships, but that's not enough for the gay lobby. It appears it must seek and destroy any who discriminate against them. Only its beliefs must prevail.

Now, Christians are discriminated against and forced into their private closets.

Do we really want Christians and their values squeezed out of British public life?

Will there be any Christians left in the public arena if we don't do something sensible, and soon?

An ex-Muslim from Birmingham writes:

*"I've discarded Islam and I want to be with others like me in the effort to break the taboo associated with leaving Islam. This organisation is significant because it represents one of the most difficult things I must deal with in my life, and is the only effort in the UK to tackle the hardships of those in much worse situations than I."*

Another ex-Muslim woman from the UK writes:

*"After 20 years of Islam, I finally gave up the prison for my freedom... It has been a long and painful journey, with many more obstacles ahead, but I am confident that things can only get better for the long-term. Well done CEMB for creating this unified voice for ex-Muslims!"*

And here's one from Pakistan:

*"I was born and raised in a Muslim family and later studied medicine, two polarizing aspects, which led me to the conclusion that there is no god... Living in a place like Pakistan, where there's zero tolerance for freedom of thought and choice, I find this Council a big step forward in the face of religious conservatism, a place where people like myself can find acceptance. I reject the religious hypocrisy that surrounds me and thank you all for accepting a free mind."*

Since its establishment in 2007, the Council of Ex-Muslims of Britain (CEMB) has become the refuge for people to come to if they have left Islam and religion. It is a hugely important sanctuary for women and men who face threats, intimidation and/or isolation for taking this step.

And, since our inception, we've always been here to help – whether it is finding a safe house and giving support or defending the right to asylum for 'apostates' fleeing Sharia law.

In the past year, we've helped hundreds of people; held an important conference on Apostasy and Sharia Law; had speaking engagements across the country & developed a number of crucial resources including Guidelines for Ex-Muslims and Frontline practitioners and an information document on Apostasy and Asylum in the UK.

But all this work needs money and the CEMB is in the worst financial situation since its inception. It is incredibly hard to get support for our work from funders, even some who might be perceived as allies ... The media and government, too, continue to avoid real discussion on the issues at hand. That's why we have to depend on you for your help in getting the word out, supporting ex-Muslims and challenging Islamism and Sharia law, which punishes 'apostates' with the death penalty.

**As** Chair of Lancashire Secular Humanist can I throw my support behind Rev Kevin Logan's opening salvo in his article 'Christians are being forced into the closet'? [L.T. Fri 28<sup>th</sup> Jan].

I couldn't agree more: anybody whose religious belief so limits their ability to integrate with the rest of society that it compels them to ignore the law of the land, certainly shouldn't be opening a B&B in Lancashire; or anywhere else in the UK for that matter.

Neither should they be considering a career as a registrar; or in marriage counselling, where they could conceivably encounter people whose lifestyle is so incompatible with their own narrow view of right & wrong it restricts their ability to provide those services.

I don't say such people should [necessarily] be confined to a closet but I do say they should not be purporting to offer a service accessible to everybody under a deluded misapprehension that they'll then be allowed to refuse it to 'some' on religious grounds.

Don't misunderstand me.

I'm very happy that we live in a country where people are free to follow whatever religious practices their little hearts' desire.

I'm delighted they're permitted to prevent whomever they want from entering the privacy of their own home: but if they put a B&B / Guest House sign outside that home they 'must' know that every member of the public has a right to access the services they are offering.

[ - I'd have thought, as Christians, they would appreciate the concept of 'a bed for the night'! ]

Similarly, such people certainly should not be compelled to work in marriage guidance or as a registrar: but having freely made such a career choice for themselves they can't then demand the right to say 'but I refuse to counsel you or marry you'.

For goodness sake grow up.

Laws forbidding prejudice don't discriminate against people who are prejudiced – they prevent discrimination against people who are not!

Come on Kevin: being gay isn't a belief – it isn't a choice.

It may be hard for you to swallow but gay people are a fact of life and as much a part of our society as you and I.

Try to look on the bright side – you could always start searching for a gay couple running a B&B and refusing accommodation to narrow minded, blinkered, homophobic, religious bigots – then you can have your day in court!

A forum is an online area where you can have discussions with other people.

They are usually about a particular topic, so anyone interested in that topic can debate and discuss with others who share their interest.

Forums can be: public – anyone can join and comment; or private – your membership has to be approved before you're allowed to join.

### Lancashire Secular Humanist's Forum

Our Forum is provided by Think Humanism.

This is an international, public forum where you can debate on humanist issues with users worldwide. However, we have our own private area within Think Humanism.

Only **LSH** members are allowed to access it.

We're keen for members to make more use of the **LSH** Forum.

It's proved successful for discussions on group decisions – such as the design of our new logo, content on the new website, and strategy for local campaigns.

But only a handful of members are using it, so only those members are making their voice heard on these decisions.

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### How to join the **LSH** Forum

Go to our website [www.lancshumanism.org.uk](http://www.lancshumanism.org.uk) and click on the "Forum" link at the bottom right hand side - There are two stages to registering.

Firstly, register with Think Humanism – click "Register" shown in the picture below circled in red and labelled "1".

Then follow the onscreen instructions.

When you've finished the registration procedure, click on "send us your username" labelled "2" in the picture below.

You will receive an email from Peter when your access to the forum has been confirmed.

Complete the details and click "Login" – circled red and labelled "3" in the picture below.

It is very important that you answer the question on religion!

It is important that the Census generates accurate figures.

It is used to legitimise resource allocation and policy . . .

The more people who tick the 'No Religion' box, the less inaccurate 'evidence' there is that government should listen to religious groups and leaders over and above other groups.  
➤ **There** will be no negative repercussions on you personally if you do . . . The Census isn't interested in you personally - it is used to find general themes in the population. Although it is not anonymous, personal data will not be traced back to you in any analysis so there should be very limited issues about privacy.

➤ **You** will be affected by negative use of the data. Social policy, services and government action affects everyone.

➤ **This** may be the last Census ever held - if we get inaccurate data we may be stuck with it forever!

➤ **An** increased percentage of non-religious people will mean an increased voice for your issues as a non-religious person in society, particularly in equality work and education.
