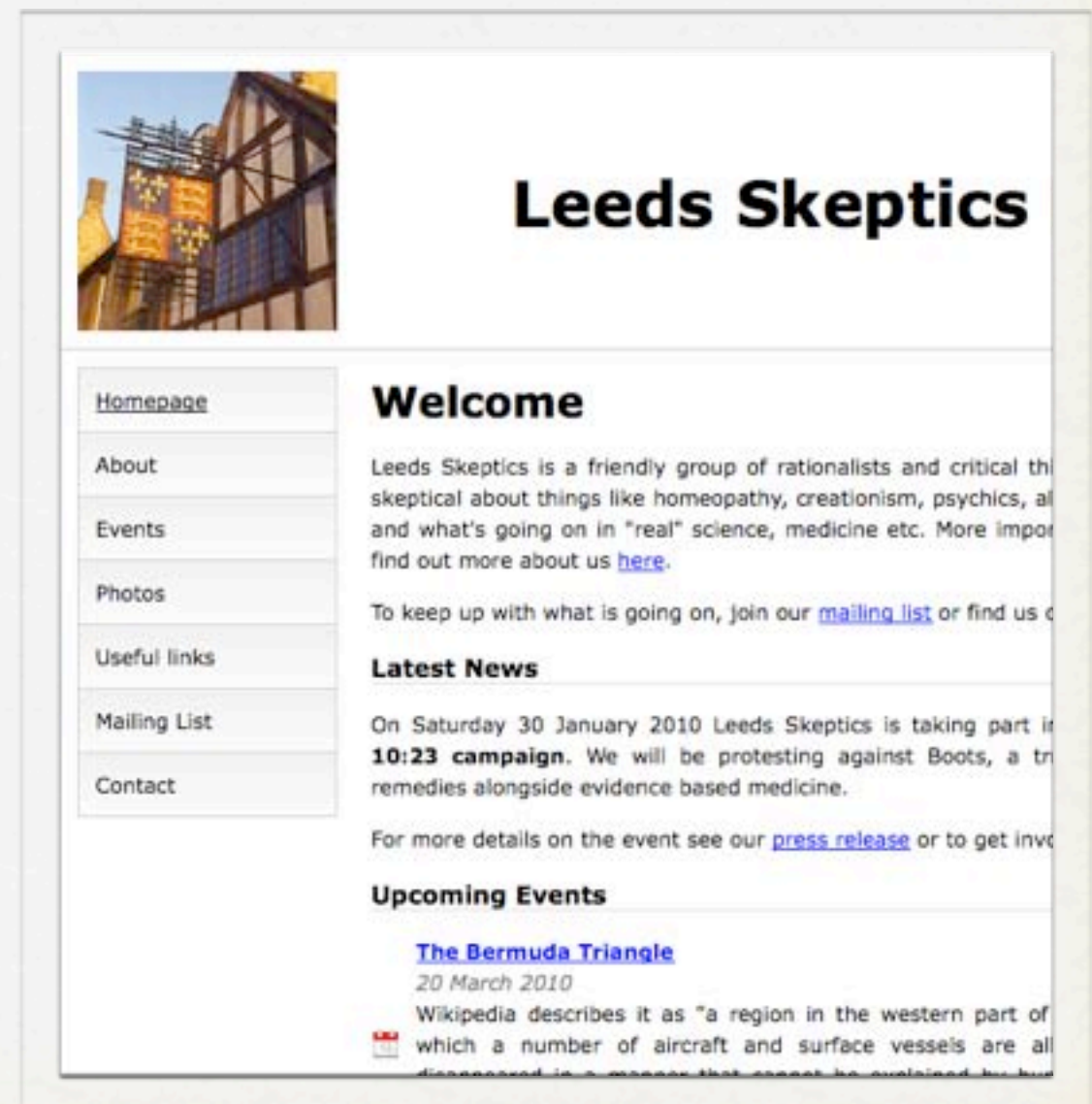

# Now you could get X-Men super powers after scientists develop world's first 'living laser' beam

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Comic book fans have long dreamed of emitting a powerful beam from their eyes like superhero Cyclops of the X-Men.

Now that dream could one day become a reality after scientists this week announced they have created the world's first 'living laser', a biological cell which is engineered to produce a laser beam.

A pioneering team used a cell from a human kidney which had been genetically engineered to produce light in the same way as a jellyfish and flooded it with blue light.

The findings, based on studies of fossilised dinosaur teeth, lend support to the idea that dinosaurs were warm-blooded creatures which regulated their body warmth.

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# Sitting down 'raises death risk by as much as 40% and is NOT countered by exercise'

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If you're reading this sitting down, then stand up. It could save your life.

Women who sit for more than six hours daily are around 40 per cent more likely to die than those sitting for less than three hours a day, a study said.

The figure was about 20 per cent for men, according to American Cancer Society researchers who looked at 123,000 people's health over 14 years.



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
