


Rationalist Week 2009

A rich history



When we first began thinking about Rationalist Week 2009, still half a year away at the time, we were struggling with ideas as to how to top last year's event once again. We had to follow the tradition of dreaming big but how do you expand an event that runs all day every day? The answer is, into the night.

Rationalist Week 2009 will begin Sunday when we begin setting up and open its doors Sunday evening. From that point on the tent will remain open until the event draws to a close on the following Saturday, 24x7 when anyone wants to come in to talk to us or just to get a free hot drink, they can.

All night debate run each Friday of Rationalist Week has always proved popular with people pouring out of the clubs and indeed of a nice hot drink and perhaps even a hot dog too. This year we're extending this to all week so that weary travellers on their way home can grab a much needed coffee and early birds who need to be up for uni in the mornings can share breakfast with us.

We've also massively expanded the amount of events running during the week. While previous years have seen around 15-20 events run throughout the week, we're looking to almost double that this year with events running throughout the day no matter what time someone drops by the tent.

We'll be running a large range of events from our previous favourites such as the Church of the Flying Spaghetti Monster and Unbaptism to an exciting range of talks and debates including inter-society debates with the Christian Union and others to be confirmed. While it is too early to provide a conclusive list of events, it will certainly be a rich and exciting timetable.

The other side to this year's Rationalist Week at Leeds is the potential opened up by the AHS. For this reason we are opening this year's event up to anyone from around the country to get involved with the biggest event of its kind in the United Kingdom. Chances are that's you!

We would like to invite everyone from around the AHS to come to Leeds for the week of April 19th to 26th to get involved with the event. You don't have to come for the whole week and you don't have to help out every day, but whatever time you can spare is much appreciated.

You don't have to worry about the cost of the week as we will be paying for travel costs. We'll also be feeding everyone involved in the event so you don't have to worry about that either.

As for somewhere to stay, we're building a staff area into the tent this year which will provide somewhere for everyone involved to take breaks and grab some sleep and if you're here for a while we can also provide a proper bed and somewhere to grab a shower too. From the event I hope everyone will gain a lot of experience with regards to running events both in general and large scale events such as Rationalist Week and probably valuable leadership experience too.
